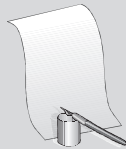

FROM OUR PASTOR



Brothers and sisters: you were once darkness, but now you are light in the Lord. Live as children of light, for light produces every kind of goodness and righteousness and truth. Try to learn what is pleasing to the Lord. (from today's Second Reading)

The quote from St. Paul given above is a challenge not only to the Ephesians, but to us as well. All of the Scripture readings today talk about light and seeing. As I am writing this I am having difficulty seeing the keyboard because the sun is so bright that the light blinds me. We need to be able to see if we are going to face the challenge of being the light that St. Paul refers to. I came across a short reflection on today's Gospel that reads: "Hundreds of people walked past the blind beggar that day and they saw only blindness and ugliness. Jesus, however, opened the box of poverty and disability and helped those in his company see God breaking into their lives. Jesus saw a God of surprises who uses a person reduced to begging to open people's eyes to divine riches." Jesus is THE light of the world. We have to see that light, revealed in the obvious and the obscure, if we are to become that light. How do we see the differences around us? Do we see them as obstacles and excuses, or are they signs and symbols of the richness of our God? Racism, prejudice, gossip, pettiness, intolerance, divisiveness, grudges, bitterness (and the list goes on) are all darkness. This Lent we are to discover the light; use it to reveal what is hidden in the darkness, have a change of heart and become light that produces "every kind of goodness, righteousness and truth." God's blessings to you all

And let's not forget the Annual Corn & Brat Roast that provides the funds to do all the above. This is not a full list of our activities, and all of our members do not participate in every activity. But when lumped all together, we can and do make a difference in our parish and community.
