FROM OUR PASTOR...

Thus says the Lord GOD: I, too, will take from the crest of the cedar, from its topmost branches tear off a tender shoot, and plant it on a high and lofty mountain; on the mountain heights of Israel I will plant it. It shall put forth branches and bear fruit, and become a majestic cedar. Birds of every kind shall dwell beneath it, every winged thing in the shade of its boughs. (From today's First Reading)



When I was very young a relative gave my family a small Colorado blue spruce as a gift from her trip to Colorado; you know the kind that they sell in a souvenir shop that no one expects to survive. My sister and brother and I were all excited and wanted to try planting the tree and watching it grow. Thank God my mother grew up on a farm and was a great gardener. All I really remember of those early years was that tree received all kinds of attention from the animals in the neighborhood and little attention from me or my siblings. Eventually the tree was large enough to be transplanted to its permanent location in our front yard. There through the grace of God it continued to flourish and grow. More than one family of birds made their nest in that tree through the years and one day, long after I left home, my mother looked out the kitchen window only to see a deer with a fawn resting beneath its branches. The tree ultimately grew so tall that officials from Mitchell Field in Milwaukee came to measure it to be sure it wasn't too tall to be that close to the airport. It wasn't too tall but was after so many years too big around to fit in the front yard and my mom had it cut down and it became the Christmas tree for one of the neighboring parishes. The memory of that tree and today's scripture readings are a reminder of how the Word of God and our Faith are meant to grow in our lives. Happy Father's Day to all the Fathers and God's blessings to you all – Fr. Mark
