

FROM OUR PASTOR...



Simon Peter said to them, "I am going fishing." They said to him, "We also will come with you." So they went out and got into the boat, but that night they caught nothing... When they had finished breakfast, Jesus said to Simon Peter, "Simon, son of John, do you love me more than these?" Simon Peter answered him, "Yes, Lord, you know that I love you." Jesus said to him, "Feed my lambs." (From today's Gospel)

There are times we tend to fall back on the familiar when things aren't going well. The apostles experienced the significant trauma of the death of Jesus, and Peter, not knowing what else to do, decides to cope by returning to something he knew – fishing. Even though the fishing probably took his mind off of things for a while, it must have been really frustrating to fish all night and catch nothing. Not even his past provided the comfort and security he was seeking. It is in this situation that Peter and the others once again encounter the risen Lord. He's not expecting it, and initially it jars him into a strange reaction – getting dressed and then jumping into the water. Things settle down and Peter and the other disciples seem to be totally absorbed in being with the Lord. Then Jesus asks Peter, not once but three times, "Do you love me?" Once again Peter is shaken from his comfort zone (is he reminded of his denying the Lord three times as well?), and recognizes the commitment he is making to follow the Lord. But he is to follow the Lord, meaning the Lord is present and leading the way. Peter needed to trust, love and follow. I can't help but see this story as our story as well. We may be tempted to go backwards to trust in something from our past, but the risen Lord invites us to trust him, love him and follow him as he moves us forward.

Once again this week we are experiencing this Gospel being lived out in our midst as we celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation with 16 of our young people on Sunday afternoon. They will stand before Bishop Haines and once again commit their lives to trust, love and follow the Lord. Keep them in your prayers that they continue to let the Holy Spirit lead them to a stronger relationship with the Lord. God's blessings to you all – Fr. Mark



Our main fundraiser is our annual Helping Hands Rummage Sale over the Memorial Day weekend, to coincide with the East Troy Community Rummage Sale.

This year, we will set up on Thursday, May 23, from 8-5, and be open for business from 8-4 pm on Friday, 5/24, and Saturday, 5/25. Clean-up will be Sunday, 5/26 after the 10 am mass. We are asking parish and community members to donate usable items in order to make our sale a success. Please make sure the items are in decent condition to sell. Our thrift clothing center will be open part of the time that the rummage sale is in progress as well. The sale is held on the clothing center grounds, across from the church.

Because we do not have room to store items, we ask that you hold on to your items until the week of the sale.
