


Annual Report, November 7, 2021

Wow, what a year it has been! I don't think any of us would have pictured events unfolding as they have this last year. Many people have been affected by a virus that was unknown to much of the world and







Clothing Center—This community clothing center is an outreach of Helping Hands and is run entirely by volunteers. The center is open every Tuesday and Saturday and sends extra clothing to Love, Inc. in Burlington.

They raise about \$725 a month and help about 50 families per week.









Sharing Sunday— The third Sunday of each month, non-perishable food and financial support is collected for the Local Food Pantry of East Troy. Our Parish averages about \$120 plus 200 pounds of groceries per month. Thank you for your continued support for this mission.

Prayer and Worship

Men's Discussion Group—Meets on Thursday mornings with men of all ages. They share in discussion about the upcoming Sunday Gospels as well as shared religious writings.





Women's Prayer Group— We welcome

women, of all ages, to attend our Tuesday morning gathering of book readings and intercessory prayers. Our goal is to become holier women, living the life of Christ, through our everyday actions.

Healing Prayer— This is a different ministry from our annual Annointing of the Sick. This Healing Prayer would be for any type of challenge you or a loved one might be experiencing. Although the reasons are as numerous as the stars in heaven, here are a few examples: struggling with a seasonal disorder, depression, an ongoing physical illness or disability, an emotional form of bondage (anger, grief, etc.), an addiction that you desire to cease and struggle to do so



alone, loneliness that has affected your peace, feeling that your parental or spousal skills are lacking, or a desire to be a better person. Anyone may attend and be in proxy (intercessor) for anyone who could use prayers. This is held the third Sunday following the 8 a.m. Mass each month.




Eucharistic Adoration— Is available every Tuesday and the First Fridays of the month after the 9:00 a.m. daily Mass.



Rosary— A communal rosary is said before the weekday masses beginning around 8:30 a.m. All are welcomed to attend.








Gerard's Embrace— Is a place for homeless, pregnant women. We hope to provide shelter and meet the immediate needs of mothers while they tap into the many other resources available to them. This is a place for the residents to set goals and work with a mentor to reach those goals. Our prayer is to help break the cycle of homelessness and poverty by helping these women to help themselves.



Helping Hands— We help people in need who live within the East Troy Community School District with financial assistance to



Knights of Columbus— We are a Catholic fraternal organization dedicated to supporting

educational, charitable, religious and social welfare needs. Since 1959, St. Peter's KC council has provided >\$100,000 for catholic education, community enrichment, and educational advancement through a variety of volunteer activities. Some of the activities are the Tootsie Roll drive benefiting people with developmental disabilities, highway cleanup, blood drive support, ETBT and Salvation Army bell ringing. Through Life Savers for Life and other activities we support pro-life projects such as ultrasound purchases for various sites. We have also raised funds for the church stained glass repair and various school requests. Annually, the KC council provides 3 scholarships to high school students, aid Gerard's Embrace and local women's shelters, disaster relief, and support our parish's Fall Festival. Human Concerns— This group focuses on works of mercy and has been going strong for 20+ years. The core of their mission focuses on pro-life, elderly care, poor in spirit, those who are incarcerated, and our youth. This past year included weekly prayers to end abortion in front of the Planned Parenthood in Delavan, weekly communion service at East Troy Manor, Heritage, and Brolen Park, and bringing communion to our homebound parishioners. We were able to include jail ministry for women in the Elkhorn jail and had 2 weeks of daily adoration during the Fortnight of Freedom up to the 4th of July. We held the Baby Bottle Boomerang for the needs of mothers at the Delavan Clinic and a diaper drive in December for Life Connections. We participated in the life chain the first Sunday in October for the Right to Life along Hwy 20 in East Troy and the Mother's and Father's Breakfast.

Service Projects

<u>Capuchin Hygiene Drive</u>. Our school families and parishioners donated hygiene products for the Capuchin Community which distributes the products to shelters within the City of Milwaukee. We collected over 30 bags full of needed hygiene products!

LiveGracefully Penny Drive. LiveGracefully is a non-profit charity that was created in memory of a local family whose 8 year old daughter passed away unexpectedly. They raise money to support medical research and provide college scholarships to local high school students. We raised over \$1000 for this charity with our school Penny Drive.

<u>Tree House Collection</u>. Our middle school students collected snacks for the Tree House, which is a local shelter for teens. This was a service project specifically selected by our students because they wanted to do something that would help children who were around their age.

Fund Raisers

Dinners To Go. Last year we began selling Dinners-To-Go as a school fundraiser. With the Covid restrictions, we were unable to gather in the school for meals, so we thought this was a great alternative. School families, parishioners, and the greater community could order various meals as well as family fun night kits to make it a fun night at home with food, games and family! We held 3 Dinners-To-Go and raised over \$1000.

<u>Fish Fry</u>. With Covid we were also forced to change our annual fish fry to a pick up dinner only. However, with two take out fish fry events we were still able to raise \$1000.

<u>Hamburger Rolls</u>. Bella and her amazing team of women helped create the East Troy famous Hamburger Rolls to sell as a take out meal. The event raised over \$1500 for the school.

<u>Catholic Soles Walk</u>. The Arch changed the way they host this annual event and made it more focused on schools creating their own local walks. With this change, they were able to match donations to the schools. So last year we raised over \$8,000.



Enrollment 2020-2021 48 students (14 school choice, 34 private paying) Due to low numbers in the middle school, we felt it was best to eliminate grades 6-8 and work on building up the school as well as those grade levels over the next few years.

Religious Education~

Religious Ed classes kicked off the 2nd week of October. We currently have 102 students enrolled in the St. Peter's program Religious Ed program ranging from grades K-11. The students are led by a team of highly competent and caring catechists who are well grounded in their faith and truly enjoy sharing this part of their students' faith journeys with them. Curriculum focuses on encountering Christ through Catholic teaching, Bible studies, and service projects that support and teach the 7 Themes of Catholic Social Teaching. All curriculum used meets the requirements of the Archdiocese of Milwaukee for parish religious education programming.

RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults)~

RCIA classes will begin on November 17, 2021. At this time, we have 1 catechumen who has requested to become a member of the Catholic Church, and 1 potential candidate who has also expressed and interest.

Children's Liturgy of the Word (CLOW)~

With the lifting of Covid restrictions by Archbishop Listecki came the ability to once again offer CLOW to our young parishioners. The Faith Formation Commission and Religious Ed office are working on bringing this offering back to our families once again!

Adult and Young Adult Programming

We currently offer adult formation through video series, small groups, and Bible studies. The Faith Formation Commission is working to expand our offerings to include programming that will inspire and connect with those wishing to grow in their faith.


FISCAL YEAR FINANCIAL REPORT 7/1/20-6/30/21


During the summer of 2021, we enlisted the services of financial advisor, **Jim Jakscht, Edward Jones,** in East Troy to manage our investments. We interviewed several capable candidates and determined Jim would be a good fit for our parish. Below are the September 24, 2021 balances for our investment accounts.

The current plan is to use the income only from the investments for each specific use. Income from the St. Peter's Parish Investment account and School Endowment account are infused into our parish and school budgets each year. When you are looking at the income for each group, these amounts are included in the calculation.

St. Peter's Parish Investment account	\$1,713,437	School Endowment account	\$ 229,301
Cemetery Perpetual Care account	\$ 312,453	School Tuition account	\$ 39,583

We continue to strive to be good stewards of both the Parish assets and your contributions. Each month, we review and scrutinize the budget. Every department did very well staying on track. Of note, the school enrollment decreased. We have been trying to find ways to increase enrollment, but to little avail. Covid has really created a difficult year in every part of our budget and attendance, in both school and parishioners. We are striving to ensure St. Peter's is here to serve and bless many generations to come.
